#### Message from the Administration Team

Welcome to the week 8 newsletter. We have a very busy couple of weeks left of term with the annual Faction Carnival on our doorstep, Country Week and the year 5/6 camp.

A HUGE congratulations to all the teams that made the grand final last weekend, what a wonderful representation of our sporting community. An even bigger congratulations to our winners, the League Football side, Junior Hockey team and Junior Football team.

School Development Day yesterday was a day of learning as staff were engaged in discovering more about the *Elastik* program. This is a way of monitoring student academic progress from assessments such as NAPLAN, ON-Entry and PAT testing. The feedback was positive and the staff are looking forward to integrating this tool into their forward planning and mapping. We also completed the online Culturally Responsive Pedagogy professional learning, this is the first of a series of professional learning that staff will be engaging in with Aboriginal Education (DoE).

The Newdegate Field Day sounds like a big hit with our students who attended. At Breakfast Club this morning the highlight shared with Mrs Mills was the 'Mullet competition', which some of our students were the successful winners of scoring cash that they were very impressed with! I have been told the weather for Newdegate Field Day is always challenging and over the last two days it has certainly been proven correct with the change in weather. I hope all that attended enjoyed their day/s.

LGDHS has signed up to be a part of the Resilience Project for 2025. This initiative will compliment our newly formed Wellbeing Committee and Respectful Relations committee and we look forward to the collaboration of the three areas. Stay tuned for more information in future newsletters.

#### Safety around schools

The rush to drop off and pick up children can sometimes cause hasty and unsafe decisions around traffic.

- Remember to check that children are buckled up before moving the car and stick to the 40km/h speed limit in school zones.
- Be aware of and always give way to buses pulling out.
- Always park and drive legally in and around schools.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop off and pick up area. Calling out to children from across the road is dangerous they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- The safest place for children to get out of the car is on the kerb side of the road, away from passing traffic.

A reminder regarding Voluntary Contributions, if you are unsure if you have paid them yet, feel free to contact the office. These payments provide additional learning opportunities and resources for your child/children.

As of the end of August admin has received 93% from Kindergarten, 91% from Pre-Primary, 76% from the Year 1-6 cohort, 47.63% from the Year 7-10 cohort, 53% of Year 7-10 Electives and 87% from the Year 12 cohort.

#### Message from the Chaplain: Brodie Simmons

#### Hello everyone!

The term seems to be flying by as we get closer to the end of the year. The last few weeks has seen an increase in students accessing the Chaplain service. During talks with students, we navigate a range of issues and I endeavour to teach some useful skills such as breathing and grounding techniques to manage emotions. You may wish to try some of these simple exercises yourself.

For Breathing: Box breaths Breathe in for 4 seconds, hold for 4 seconds, release for 4 seconds and then wait for 4 seconds before inhaling again. This simple technique is one of the easiest to remember and it's great for high emotion times to calm the body and mind.

For Grounding: Name 5 Take a minute to name 5 things you can see, 4 that you can hear, 3 that you can feel, 2 that you can smell and 1 thing that you can taste. This technique is useful for lowering stress and anxiety.

Christmas Shoeboxes It's the time of year for Operation Christmas Child. For those of you who have not heard about this wonderful initiative, it involves packing and sending gifts in shoeboxes to children who may never have received a gift before. The shoeboxes can be packed with a variety of items including hygiene items, toys, clothing and school supplies for children aged between 2 to 14 years.
